



1.1.Total area and number of municipalities by province. 2006





1.3. Land cover and land use in Andalusia, 2003*





To this end the land cover database obtained from the digital satellite imagery of the Autonomous Community and its subsequent analysis is exploited statistically at different spatial levels.




1.6. Area reforested in reforestation activities by province. 2006


Evolution of the area burned according to type in Andalusia. 1989-2006 (ha)

SO,: to calculate the index the 24 hours limit value (daily average over 125 $\mu g/m^3$) set out in the Directive 1999/30 is considered. However if the 1 h limit value (470 μ g/m³) laid down in the same directive is exceeded, the air quality will be considered "bad" and "very bad" when the alert threshold (value for 3 consecutive hours higher than 500μ g/m³ is exceeded)

Suspended particles: to calculate the index the 24 hours limit value (daily average over 70 µg/m³) set out in the Directive 1999/30 is considered. NO, to calculate the index the hourly limit value (290 70 $\mu g/m^3$) set out in the Directive 1999/30 is considered. When the alert threshold (value for 3 consecutive hours higher than 400 μg/m³) is exceeded the air quality will be considered "very bad"

Ozone: to calculate the index the objective value for the protection of health laid down by the new Directive (eight hour value of $20\mu \, g/m^3$) is considered. When the value of information to the public (hourly value of 180 μ g/m³) is exceeded the air quality will be considered "bad" and "very bad" when the alert threshold for the population (hourly value of 240 μ g/m³) is exceeded.



Andalusian Population Census 2001. The Population Census is a statistical source of doubtless interest for a greater demographic comprehension of the Spanish and, in particular, the Andalusian population. The census is taken every ten years, and establishing the number of inhabitants in each

territorial area and recognizing their specific demographic, cultural, economic and social features are among its main goals. It furnishes a structural representation of the population that serves the Administration and numerous users as a basis for decision-making and research.


The last available census was taken with reference to the 1st November 2001. For the first time in the history of Census taking, personalised questionnaires were used making the most of the information in the Municipal Register of Inhabitants.

In Andalusia, the Institute of Statistics of Andalusia (IEA) participated thanks to a collaboration agreement with the National Institute of Statistics (INE) in the elaboration of this census, as in the previous one of 1991.

Municipal Register of Inhabitants (MRI).

The MRI is the roll of inhabitants of each municipality, which includes name, surnames and address that must be permanently updated. It is, therefore, an administrative register, but also has a statistical use as it provides a population count and information on important demographic variables, such as gender and age.


The MRI was corrected annually (these were the so called census corrections) and it was completely renewed every five years (the so called census renewals) until the Law 4/1996 of 10 January came into effect, amending the law 7/1985 of 2 April, regulating the Bases of the Local Regime in connection with the Municipal Register. From this law, a continuous register through the coordination and collation of the registers of all the municipalities was implemented; in this way, the census revisions are obtained on 1st of January of every year. The INE is the organism responsible for this task.

Vital Statistics (VS). VS refer to births, marriages and deaths that take place in the Spanish territory. It is a statistical operation aimed at improving information on population flows

Civil Registers are the primary source of information. They send monthly bulletins of childbirths, marriages and deaths to the delegations of the INE. These bulletins are filled in on registering these demographic events in Civil Registers.

The classification criteria of the three demographic events that integrate VS are multiple. Thus, births are tabulated according to gender, birthplace, parents' age, etc. Likewise, deaths are classified according to age, place and cause of death. Finally, for marriages, age, marital status, profession of the spouses etc. are taken into account. Information on same-sex marriages is gathered after the law 13/2005, of July 1, which modifies the Civil Code regarding the right to get married, comes into force.

is that which differentiates between domestic and international migrations according to whether the displacements occur within the country or between the country and abroad. Furthermore, the data are facilitated based on different criteria, such as gender, age group, academic qualification, etc.







Labour Force Survey (LFS). INE. Elaborated by the National Institute of Statistics (INE) since 1964, it is a quarterly sample survey and not an exhaustive study.

Its purpose is to provide information on the labour market: composition and evolution of the number of economically active, employed, unemployed and inactive persons according to different classification criteria, such as gender, age, economic sector, profession and other relevant aspects. At the same time, this information is available by different levels of spatial aggregation: national, autonomous community and province.

The survey is focused on the population living in main households; it has an initial sample size of


65.000 families a quarter, implying coverage of approximately 200.000 people.

In 2005 the LFS was modified for various reasons:

- Adaptation to the new demographic and labour reality, due especially to the rise in the number of resident foreigners.
 - New Eurostat regulations.
- Improvements in data collection methods. The implementation of these modifications generates changes in the population series(1). The INE web site offers detailed information on these changes, their repercussions, as well as retrospective data.


4.3. Evolution of employment rates. 1988-2006*

4.4. Unemployed population according to time spent job searching. 2006* (percentage)





Quarterly Labour Costs Survey (QLCS). INE.

This is a continuous quarterly statistical operation, elaborated by the INE, a component part of the euro indicators that Eurostat has requested of the EU Member States to measure the convergence in labour costs. It aims to provide information on average labour costs per worker and month, as well as on hour worked. This survey enables the time worked and not worked to be monitored obtaining estimates of the average workday.

The population scope is made up of all salaried workers with contributions to social insurance schemes, regardless of their size, included in the General Regime of the Social Security and in the Special Regime for Coal Mining.

Until the 4th quarter of 2003 this survey was denominated Labour Cost Index (LCI). From the 1st quarter of 2004 it became the Quarterly Labour Cost Survey (QLCS).

Its basic object is to obtain information on the annual average labour costs by worker, detailing its main components: wages costs, compulsory contributions to the Social Security, voluntary contributions and direct social benefits, dismissal pay, professional training expenses, transport expenses, other expenses and subsidies.







Health care resources and their distribution. The statistics that provide information on health care resources come fundamentally from the Regional Government Ministry of Health and the Andalusian Health Service, contributing information on two levels:

 Primary Care: it is the first level of health care carried out in health centres, doctor's surgeries and other centres. Primary care integrates preventive, curative, and rehabilitation care and health promotion. The information offered in this area refers mainly to public centres and services and makes up the Statistics on Primary Care Activity of Andalusia, compiled by the Andalusian Health Service. Its main source of information is the Information System for the Management of Primary Care.

• **Specialist Care:** it offers the means for diagnosis, treatment and rehabilitation that, for their specialisation or characteristics, cannot be solved at primary care level; it includes clinics, outpatient departments and hospitals. The information gathered in this area may refer to public as well as private centres, depending on the source studied. Thus, the Catalogue of Andalusian Hospitals, elaborated by the Regional Government Ministry of Health,

offers information on the resources and establishments with inpatient regime, both public and private, of the Andalusian hospital network. On the other hand, if the source employed comes from the Andalusian Health Service (Statistics on Specialist Care Activity of Andalusia), more detailed information on hospitals that make up the public network is provided.

Utilisation of health care resources. The information herein refers to primary or specialist care to which it is possible to add the information supplied by the Statistics on Health Establishments Providing Inpatient Care of Andalusia, elaborated by the Regional Government Ministry of Health as well as by the Statistics on Basic Hospital Data of Andalusia, exploitation of the information provided in the Minimum Basic Data Set on Hospital Discharges of the Andalusian Health Service

These statistical activities, together with the abovementioned Statistics on Specialist Care Activity of Andalusia of the Andalusian Health Service offer detailed information on the entire hospital process, as well as data relating to the activities carried out in non-structured surgeries in external outpatient clinics compiled by the information system of the appointment system.

Furthermore, other specific sources provide information on pharmaceutical benefits and the utilisation of specific centres and health care services whether in infant vaccinations, organ transplants, blood donation, abortions, etc.







Industrial Production Index of Andalusia (**IPIAN). IEA.** The object of the IPIAN is to indicate the monthly evolution experienced by the fraction of the Gross Value Added (GVA) originated in the industrial sector with regard to a previous period denominated base period.

The implementation scope of the IPIAN is the economic sector of the Autonomous Community of Andalusia.

To determine the indicator base period, an attempt to use a prices and production regime

similar to regular situations has been made. The selected year is 2002, which is not very remote and since when no extraordinary events have modified the production regime.

The selected reference period has been 2000, as all the necessary information to calculate the coefficients, obtained by means of the Input-Output Chart of Andalusia was available.

Industrial Survey of Companies and Industrial Survey of Products. INE. These surveys are a follow up of the no longer existing Industrial Survey and make a full analysis of the activity of the industrial sector possible. In Andalusia, the IEA presents the same publications in greater detail for the Autonomous Community named Annual Industrial Survey of Companies. The main purpose of these annual surveys is to provide in the shortest possible time reliable information relating to the chief characteristics of the diverse sectors that make up the industrial activity of the economy, not only with respect to the employment they generate but also to their operating, investment and production expenses.

The goal is, in this way, to satisfy national and international information requirements on this subject.

The designation change of these publications, initiated in 1993, came about through the commitment to adapt to the Regulation PRODCOM (PRODuccion COMunitaria - COMmunity Production) - relating to the harmonisation of the industrial production characteristics in European Union countries - and it fulfils Eurostat, the official European statistical organism, recommendations. The essential difference with respect to the previous *Industrial Survey* is that now the survey unit is the company for the Industrial *Survey of Companies* and the establishment *for the Industrial Survey of Products*.



7.4. Evolution of final energy consumption by activity sector in Andalusia. 2005







8.2. Evolution of houses under construction according to housing regime in Andalusia. 1987-2006



House building statistics. Ministry of Public Works This monthly statistics has been made since 1990 from the questionnaire the promoter or technician responsible for a project must submit to the Town Hall when soliciting the license for building work, demolition and renovation of buildings. It offers information mainly on the following variables: general features of the building work (location, legal basis, type of promoter, estimated duration); estimates of building materials; number and characteristics of

the buildings (purpose, surface area and volume, number of storeys, building type and facilities); number and characteristics of the houses (total living space, number of rooms –bathrooms- and type of finish). Data are broken down at Autonomous Community and provincial level; exploitation of municipal data (individualised for those of more than 10000 inhabitants and aggregates for those of a lesser size) are also elaborated.



cities of Ceuta and Melilla. The variables on which information for each appraisal is offered are: transaction type (protected housing and free market), valuation date, geographical codes, built surface, total square metres, valuation price and year of construction.









It is aimed at the elaboration, management and upgrade of a directory of the existing centres of production of goods and services in the Autonomous Community of Andalusia, supplying knowledge on their basic structural data.

It is, therefore, a reference framework for taking censuses, elaborating surveys by sampling and statistical adjustment of data, whenever the units studied carry out an economic activity.

There is a constant upgrade performed from diverse sources such as administrative registers, surveys and sector files of different activities.


In the 2005 data a methodological change has been carried out including new activities:

- Those carried out in mobile units or without permanent facilities (street sellers, fairground stalls, etc.).
- Those carried out, although in a permanent way, in enclosures that are not buildings (outdoor activities, in ephemeral or provisional facilities).

• Those carried out in family houses without exterior signs and without easy public access or in which one or several rooms of the family house are not dedicated to.

Central Business Directory. INE. Updated on 1st of January 2006, it is an information source to analyse company registrations, cancellation and continuity, which is known as business demography.

It embodies structured information on magnetic storage media, with identification, location and classification data according to the number of people employed and the economic activity carried out by the establishments, coming from registers and statistical files, rounded off with information from the INE. It is aimed mainly at setting up a framework to design sub-populations for survey elaboration and to provide a source to develop structural statistics on companies.



(thousands of euros)



Survey on the Tourism Situation of Andalusia (STSA). IEA. Its goal is to face up to the needs and shortages of information in the tourism sector in Andalusia.

It is a continuous quarterly survey aimed at identifying the number, distribution and characteristics of the travellers that move around Andalusia for tourism, the amount and composition

of their spending in the region, as well as their motivation to travel in Andalusia and their estimation on the services received during their stay.

A new methodology is applied in this survey for the second quarter of 2006, which modifies features such as zoning, sample design or the estimation procedures used to calculate some of the main variables.

Hotel Occupancy Survey. Data for Andalusia. (IEA). This is a monthly source to assess the tourism sector activity. The information is achieved by means of a survey in hotel establishments of the Autonomous Community of Andalusia. The same activity is carried out by the INE, but for the whole country.

The general aim of the hotel occupancy survey is to obtain monthly synthetic indexes that evaluate

the tourism sector activity, allowing short-term forecasts to be made. It offers information on hotels by category, province, zone and tourist area, and resident country of the travellers. The 2006 data are not comparable with those published in 2005, as a new estimate has been carried out on hotel establishments.





As of January 2004 the College of Registrars of Deeds of Spain supplies centralized information to the INE.

Data on rural and urban properties, classified by province and Autonomous Community are published, as well as, by the type of entity that grants the loan. From 2006 information on mortgage register changes and cancellations is disseminated.

11.4. Evolution of the number of urban property mortgages. 2003-2006 (number of mortgages/1000 inhabitants)



(trading companies created/10000 inhabitants)



The data supplied by the companies that must compulsorily lodge their annual accounts in Mercantile

Registers have different statistical uses. On the one hand it serves as information base for the estimates of the macro-magnitudes of the Andalusian economy. On the other hand, it is used to upgrade the directory of establishments and companies and, also, to perform micro-economic or business studies.



Insolvency proceedings: bankruptcy proceedings can be initiated when the debtor is insolvent, that is, when the debtor is unable to pay his liabilities on a regular basis.

Voluntary insolvency proceedings: the petition is presented by the debtor in the two months following the date in which he/she would have or should have known his/her insolvency status.

Compulsory insolvency proceedings: the petition is submitted by any of the debtor's creditors. The origin, nature, amount, acquisition and maturity dates of the credit as well as the credit status at the time of filing the application must be specified.

Statistics on Insolvency Proceedings. INE.

Statistics on Receiverships and Declared Bankruptcies needs to be substituted by a new statistics, the Statistics on Insolvency Proceedings as of September 1 2004, when the Organic Law 8/2003 for Insolvency Law Reform and Insolvency Law 22/2003 come into force, as the legal concept of receiverships and declared bankruptcies is replaced by "concurso de acreedores" ("creditors" meeting"), with the entities subjected to these procedures being called "deudores concursados" ("debtors"). The statistics provides quarterly data on the number of debtors as well as the type of insolvency proceedings (voluntary or compulsory), the type of procedure (ordinary or abbreviated), existing advance arrangement proposals and their content (debt reduction, extension of time, debt reduction and extension of time or any other proposal).



Foster families: social protection measure put forward for minor in specific circumstances by which he/she is temporarily introduced into a family which is not made up by his natural parents. This situation will last until the minor can be reinstated in its origin family, or to be reinserted in his/her social environment when he/she is old enough to reach his/her own emancipation or until the minor can be adopted. The foster family may receive an economic compensation and there is not any familial parental bond.

Adoption: legal measure by which a minor is definitely introduced into a family which is not made up by his natural parents, with the same consideration, respect, rights and duties as the natural children. The adopting family takes on all the patria potestas duties, disappearing, except in extraordinary cases, all links between the minor and his natural parents

Beneficiaries of non-contributory retirement pensions: Persons of sixty-five and over without adequate resources are entitled to this type of pension, although they have never paid contributions or not sufficiently. They must have resided between the date of the their 16th birthday and the date of claiming the pension in Spanish territory or in a European Union country for ten years of which two must have been consecutive and immediately prior to claiming the benefits.

Beneficiaries of non-contributory disability pensions: Persons entitled to this type of pension are those between eighteen and sixty five with a disability or chronic illness of 65% or over; people who want to obtain the economic complement of 50% for third person's help having a disability or chronic illness of 75% and over and exceed the established scale. They must reside in Spanish territory and must have been living in Spain or in a European Union country for five years of which two must have been consecutive and immediately prior to claiming the benefits.

Benefits from the Law of Social Integration of the Disabled (LISMI): these benefits are aimed at providing disabled people with the essential means for the exercise of their rights, and to guarantee the minimum economic, legal and social resources.

Benefits for illness/old age from the Social Protection Fund (F.A.S.): these benefits apply to people whose personal or family revenues are inadequate to cover their basic needs



Library Statistics. INE. The main goals are: to provide information relating to the physical equipment and human resources of the libraries, to measure the variations in the activity of the libraries, to evaluate the funds designated for this activity and to facilitate international comparability. Results are obtained by type of library and autonomous community.

These statistics are made biennially and their scope extends to all the libraries in the Spanish territory, whatever their administrative dependency, except school and private ones not open to the

public. The information applies to the natural year, although some features refer to 31st of December of the year the study was conducted.

The INE has elaborated these statistics since 1960. However, they were reorganized in 1972 to adapt to UNESCO recommendations in the 1970 conference. Since 2002 some changes have been introduced, such as the new library definition based on ISO 2789, a new classification of the types of libraries and delves deeper into the implementation of the information and communication technologies in libraries.



Machines type B: recreational machines that, in return for the price of the game, give the users a time to play and, eventually, a prize whose value cannot exceed twenty times the price of the game. This type of instrument must return at least 75%of the bets carried out.

Television Audience Yearbook. SOFRES, Media Audience. It provides data and expressive analysis on television audience tendencies. To this end it measures and monitors the television audience through the audiometers provided to a representative panel of homes.

The panel is made up of primary residences with television in the Peninsula, the Balearic and Canary Islands and all the individuals aged 4 and

over living there. The regional sample is not proportional because in some communities with autonomous television it has been oversized in order to guarantee satisfactory sample for studies that include percentage wise reduced variables. In 2005, there were 3.305 homes in the panel, at the moment the figure is in excess of 3.840 homes with audiometers.



16.1. Composition of the Andalusian Parliament







16.4. Participation in the Referendum to Reform the Statute of Autonomy of Andalusia held on 18 February 2007 (percentage)






16.6. Evolution of the queries and complaints made to the Andalusian Ombudsman*. 1991-2006

Judicial statistics. INE. Judicial statistics have been published every year since 1959 and supply data, broken down by province, on the activity of the courts of the different judicial fields, common, civil, contentious-administrative and juvenile courts. It has been carried out since 1995 in collaboration with the General Council of the Judicial Power. The information extends to diverse variables: cases registered and solved, sentences, type of offence, sentence imposed, people involved, etc.

The information is gathered in bulletins submitted on a quarterly basis by the judicial bodies except the Magistrates Court which does it six monthly.


Likewise, the macroeconomic picture of Andalusia for 2005 is included, presenting the different components of the gross domestic product at market prices based on demand, supply and income generation.

Regional Accounting since 1980, experiencing in this period several base changes. This publication is integrated in the European System of Accounts (ESA) and uses the definitions and standards established by this system.

Annual regional accounting of Andalusia. Base 2000. Series 1995-2005. IEA. From the new structures provided by the input-output framework 2000 (MIOAN-00), continuity is provided to the System of Economic Accounts of Andalusia.

Different conceptual and statistical changes regarding the information published in the previous base accountant corresponding to 1995 have been incorporated. The different modifications are aimed

at improving reliability and precision of the estimates and not only affect the processes of obtaining annual aggregates but also the use of new statistical sources.

In turn, EUROSTAT recommendations on the necessity of carrying out a base change in the accounting estimates every five years are fulfilled.

This activity follows the new European System of National and Regional Accounting (ESA 1995) methodology, in force in the European Union.
