# Read the following text about *public art* and answer the questions below:

#### All Eyes on Public Art

Have you ever found art where you weren't expecting it? Maybe you've seen a sculpture in a public park or a mural painted on a wall. These are examples of public art. Public art is often site-specific. This means that the artist creates the work for a particular space or community. These artists often want to capture people's attention and sometimes start conversations—or controversies! Public art can be anywhere and is for everyone to enjoy.

*Murals* are works that artists paint on walls. Murals can be made indoors or outdoors. A very famous 20th-century Mexican muralist was Diego Rivera, who wanted to make his art accessible to the public. Rivera frequently painted workers in factories.

Artists must select materials carefully for public outdoor *sculptures*. They might use materials, like metal, that can resist the elements, or natural materials that the artist knows will deteriorate over time.

Another form of public art is *Street Art*. Artists often create street art on the exteriors of buildings, sometimes without permission. It's important to know that, without permission, this type of art is illegal. British artist Banksy is famous for his graffiti, which provoke social commentary. The artist is anonymous: his identity is a mystery. Banksy usually doesn't get permission to put his art on private property. Before he became famous, the local government in London used to clean his work from the walls.

A *monument* is a statue, building, or other structure that commemorates a historic event or figure. An example is the Statue of Liberty. France gave the famous statue to the United States as a present in 1886. The work is a symbol of freedom, and welcomes immigrants coming to the U.S.
