SECTION 1. Andalusian Sustainable Financing Framework

Sustainable finance development in Junta de Andalucía

The **Government of the Autonomous Community of Andalusia** (in Spanish, Junta de Andalucía) published its **Sustainable Finance Framework**⁽¹⁾ ("Framework"), in March 2021.

This framework represents a step forward in the gradual alignment of the Junta de Andalucía's funding strategy with the principles of sustainable finance, the **Sustainable Bond Guidelines** (2018), the **Green Bond Principles** (GBP, 2018), the **Social Bond Principles** (SBP, 2020) and the **Green Loan Principles** (2021).

Junta de Andalucía's Sustainable Finance Framework obtained a **Second Party Opinion** from **Sustainalytics**, which stated that said Framework is credible, impactful and aligns with market practice⁽²⁾.

During **2021-2024, all public issues of the Junta de Andalucía** (for a total amount of **€3.85 bn**) were labelled as 'sustainable'.

SECTION 1. Andalusian Sustainable Financing Framework

Governance

Use of Proceeds

The proceeds raised through Sustainable Finance instruments of Junta de Andalucía **will be exclusively allocated to environmental projects and social projects**", in line with the eligibility criteria set forth in the Framework.

Project Evaluation and Selection process

The process to select and evaluate the eligibility of the Junta de Andalucía programs and projects is carried out under the responsibility of a **Sustainable Financing Committee** integrated into the regional Ministry of Finance.

Management of proceeds

The proceeds of the Sustainable Financing Instrument will be allocated to budgetary Programmes in the General Budget of Junta de Andalucía, corresponding to **the fiscal year of the Sustainable Financing Instrument**'. Junta de Andalucía has internal systems in place to track the net proceeds of its Sustainable Finance instruments. The Sustainable Financing Committee will monitor and **avoids any double allocation of funds**.

Allocation and Impact Reporting

Junta de Andalucía will provide information on the amount allocated to sustainable bonds for each year, detailing the eligible categories, as well as the estimate of the social and environmental impacts or results of the eligible programs. **The allocation and impact reports** will be published on the website of the Junta de Andalucía⁽¹⁾

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



C. Eligible expenditures financed with the sustainable bond issued in 2023



C. Eligible green expenditures financed with the sustainable bond issued in 2023



Andalusia has established the procedure for recognizing the dependency situation and the right to benefits from the **System for Autonomy and Dependency Care in the Autonomous Community (SAAD)**.



Within the framework of the SAAD, the **Annual Action Plan** has the following objectives:

- Improve the quality of life and promote the personal autonomy of the elderly, disabled, and dependent people.
- ✓ Facilitate access for individuals to the services and benefits of the SAAD.
- ✓ Promote **innovation** in social services.
- Encourage collaboration with the private sector in the field of social services.
- ✓ Contribute to the **eradication of violence against women**.





a) Residential Care Service

In 2023, **28,704** dependent individuals were served in residential care ✓ The Residential Care Service for people in a situation of dependency is provided in social centers that, as a substitute family offer for home. the accommodation. community living. and comprehensive care from a biopsychosocial approach to individuals who need support to perform basic daily activities, and this has not been able to be provided through the adaptation of the environment.

Andalusia maintains absolute and historic high of people served at the end of 2023, with 28,704 beneficiaries (11,274 men and 17,430 women), 1,798 more than at the end of the previous year (an increase of 6.68%).









b) Day Center Service

- ✓ The Day Center Service provides comprehensive care during the daytime period with the aim of maintaining or improving the highest possible level of personal autonomy through programs and therapies adapted to the specific situation of each individual. This service is designed to optimize the quality of life both for the dependent person and their socio-family environment, promoting their stay in their usual setting. Individuals are guaranteed transportation and meal services.
- ✓ As of December 31, 2023, the number of beneficiaries of the day center service reached 14,657 people (6,839 men and 7,818 women). Compared to 2022, there has been an increase of 3.87% in the number of beneficiaries of this service."

c) Respite Care Service



This program is aimed at **collaborating with the family caregiver of a dependent person**, providing support through a temporary residential service. The actions are carried out through assistance with daily activities, occupational therapy, companionship, and others. These actions take place in a residential setting, including accommodation and full board, **for periods ranging from 24 hours to one month**, in cases of respite, illness, hospitalization, emergency, and other similar circumstances of the family members

In 2023, the places recovered in 2022 were maintained (when the number increased from 58 in 2021 to 339). Of the **339 places**, 201 are for the elderly and 138 for people with disabilities.

d) Home Help Service

The home help service is a service primarily provided at home, offering a range of **preventive**, **educational**, **rehabilitative**, **and care actions** to individuals and households with difficulties in remaining or functioning in their usual environment provided by qualified and supervised personnel. The service includes personal assistance with basic daily activities and coverage of domestic needs.

As of December 31, 2023, the Autonomous Community of Andalusia has **155,969 beneficiaries** of the Home Help Service (44,756 men and 111,213 women).

e) Economic Allowance


- Incorporation of dependent individuals into the System for Autonomy and Dependency Care as beneficiaries of financial benefits for care in the family environment, linked to the service, and for personal assistance.
- ✓ In Andalusia, during 2023, more than 90,000 people were served through one of the financial benefit modalities (for care in the family environment and support for non-professional caregivers, linked to the service, and personal assistance), with the year 2023 closing at 87,331 beneficiaries, representing 30.5% of the total dependent beneficiaries in Andalusia.


f) Teleassistance Service

- ✓ It is a personalized care system that facilitates assistance to individuals through the use of communication and information technologies, providing:
 - ✓ Direct and personalized attention to any need 24 hours a day.
 - ✓ Immediate response to emergency situations.
 - Immediate recognition of the person and automatic access to their data.
 - ✓ Personal and periodic follow-up, through alerts to family members.
- ✓ The number of dependent individuals using the telecare service in 2023 reached 133,935 (35,304 men and 98,631 women). Of these, 51,213 are individuals with moderate dependency (level I), 57,399 with severe dependency, and 25,323 with major dependency.

Its objective is the promotion and protection of children's rights; it is articulated through the *Child Protection System*. Provides funds for the protection of minors at risk, in a situation of helplessness, wards, fostered, adopted or in charge of families at risk of poverty, as well as for the promotion of the social and professional inclusion of young people from the Child Protection System. During 2022, projects and measures such as the following have been financed within this budget program:







a. Residential Care

Its purpose is to promote the full development of the personality of minors and their social integration. It is inspired by a care model in which the interest of the minors in care, the technical quality and kindness of the professional actions, and an operating dynamic based on the family coexistence model prevail, thus guaranteeing the satisfaction of the basic needs of childhood and adolescence.

In 2023, funds have been provided for the management of places in the Child Protection System and the maintenance of the network of protection centers, both public and subsidized, which correspond, according to their typology, to the specificity of minors in depending on their specific needs, such as **immediate reception centers**, **behavioral disorder centers, social conflict centers, disability centers, basic residential care centers and social and labor inclusion centers**. Specific attention has been provided to **unaccompanied foreign minors** through immediate attention, individual study and diagnosis, and orientation and integration.

b. Family Foster Care

It finances a broad set of actions aimed at achieving the **full integration of minors into a family unit** appropriate to their needs, to offer them an emotional environment of coexistence.

In 2023, the **recruitment of families** for foster care, the **training** and psychosocial evaluation of the family, the **psychosocial preparation** of the minor for foster care, the **monitoring** and support of the minor and the family during the foster care period and the **mediation** in the child's visits to his biological family have been financed.

Family foster care **has also been subsidized**, so that the attention and care provided to fostered minors does not entail an economic loss for the foster families.

c. Social and Employment Integration Program (*Of age* Program)

Its objective is to maintain and promote the personal autonomy, social and professional insertion of young people who have gone through the Child Protection System.

In 2023, **2,376** young people from the Minor Protection System have been assisted In 2023, personal autonomy apartments have been financed, where their basic accommodation and maintenance needs are covered and they have the support of the team of counselors to promote their job placement, and the **Day Centers**, where they receive advice, training and guidance to their socio-laboral integration.

Among the autonomy apartments, **exclusive apartments for extutored women** have also been financed, which, along with accommodation, maintenance and socio-labor guidance, also provide guidance and training to prevent possible situations of gender violence and recruitment by trafficking networks.

d. Financial Aid Program for families with children to satisfy basic needs

They are **complementary benefits of Community Social Services** of a monetary, labor or in-kind nature and are granted to families with dependent minors who lack sufficient economic resources to meet their basic needs.





They are aimed at the **prevention**, **reduction or suppression of factors that generate situations of difficulty or social risk** for children and adolescents, in order to promote their permanence and integration in the family and social environment, avoiding situations of lack of protection that could occur if the same circumstances continue.

In 2023 16,000 families and 30,000 minors received these aids

During the year 2023, the Program has served **1,808** minors: 1,369 girls and 305 boys

e. Evaluation, Diagnosis and Treatment Program for child victims of sexual violence

It offers a comprehensive intervention, articulated through two types of interconnected actions: on the one hand, the **evaluation and diagnosis** of minors who are potential victims of sexual violence; on the other hand, **specialized psychological treatment and legal advice** through the corresponding specialized teams



The Program has received recognition from independent institutions:


The Save The Children report "*Eyes that do not want to see*", published in 2017, considered it an **example of good practice** in the evaluation and treatment of minor victims of sexual violence.

In 2019, the victimology experts from the University of Barcelona granted the recognition of "**Excellence**" in the application of the quality standards of the Children's Houses or *Barnahus model*, which coordinates in the same space all the services involved in a case of child sexual abuse: police, child protection service, justice and health. This speeds up the judicial process and reduces the secondary victimization that child victims of abuse usually suffer.

SECTION 3.2. Green Programs

Renewable energy and energy efficiency

Eligible Category

The Energy Network of the Regional Government of Andalusia (**REDEJA**) is the tool designed to apply principles of energy saving and efficiency in the buildings of the Regional Government of Andalusia (hospitals, secondary schools, administrative offices, sports facilities, public universities, etc.), which **together annually demand nearly 1,000,000 megawatt-hours** (MWh).

The goal of REDEJA is to optimize energy consumption through the centralized procurement of nearly 5,000 supply points with a 100% renewable origin guarantee certificate.



During 2023, there were two Framework Agreements for the supply of electricity with renewable origin guarantees for entities affiliated with REDEJA. The awarded company must prove that **100% of the total electricity supplied is supported by renewable origin certificates and high-efficiency cogeneration certificates**.

The aim is for all entities affiliated with the Energy Network Junta de Andalucía to offset their electricity consumption with an equivalent production from renewable energy sources. Multiple Programs


